Japan Bioindustry Association

- A nonprofit organization dedicated to the promotion of bioscience, biotechnology and bioindustry in both Japan and the rest of the world.
- Created by the support of industry, academia and government in 1942.
- Only organization of its kind in Japan.
- Members: 225 major companies from diversified industrial sectors, 89 public institutes and 1,055 individuals from academia, industry and public sectors.

ABS Implementation in Japan

Implementation of ABS Provisions:

- 1. Japan ratified CBD in 1993.
- 2. Ministry of Economy, Trade and Industry (METI) is a National Competent Authority for ABS in Japan.
- 3. JBA has been implementing CBD-related projects on behalf of METI since 1993.

4. The Bonn Guidelines (BG):

JBA implemented BG by public seminars in Japan's major cities in 2002 and 2003.

5. Users' Response to BG:

"BG are too general for users. Guidelines should be more user-friendly".

6. Need for User-specific Guidelines:


METI & JBA decided to develop 'User-specific guidelines' on the basis of CBD and BG.

METI & JBA developed:

'The Guidelines on ABS for Users in Japan'

Published on 1 April 2005,
Disseminated by Public Seminars in Japan's Major Cities,
Translated into English in February 2006.
